New Section CATC SUPPORT **- Continuous Education**

The QAP document mentions what Continuous Education is important for the Cisco Networking Academy Program.

Cisco/CATC and/or Regional Academies must provide continuous Education for its respective academies according to the structure that have the program defined. After the initial training, the instructors must be provided of Continuous Education from their training academy, even that it is not the only way of getting it. The continuous Education might happen in person or thru videoconferences, virtual sessions, actualization meetings or conferences.

Support visits, workshops, training, or other related activity with the professional development of each person, can be included, even with personal trainings relegated to the area of the curricula. Continuous Education requirements are: At least 4 hour training additional is required for each course that the instructor has finished. This requirement starts from the first 12 months after have completed its initial training. To be more clear on these, let's see the following example: If an instructor took his first training (CCNA 1) on October 2001 and he has already been trained with the 4 CCNA modules, starting from October 2002 must take 16 hours of Continuous Education (4 hours for each module) during the next year.

Regional Academies' instructors, main contacts and the CATC's must send at least one instructor to the Cisco Networking Academy annual conference, this year's annual conference was held at Networkers. This conference is an independent requirement for Continuous Education, but the assistance could be part of the hours required. The assistance to Networkers equals 16 hours of annual Continuous Education.
